Report: GNITS MUN, 2021

G. Narayanamma Institute of Technology and Sciences for Women (GNITS) hosted GNITS MUN, an Intra-College conference held on the 26th, 27th and 28th of November, 2021. With over 125 delegates and the best executive board in the city, GNITS MUN was all set to serve.

The opening ceremony began on a formal note, with Mr MV Krishna Rao IPS (Retd.), Mr. Rama Linga Reddy, Vice Principal of the institution graced the occasion. Mr MV Krishna Rao invigorated the crowd with his insightful stories and what delegates must learn from them. It was soon followed by the Secretary-General, Fareeha Hameed, addressing the gathering and declaring the conference open.

The Commission on Status of Women convened to discuss women rights and gender based violations with special emphasis on domestic violence. 42 nations took part in the conference, each sharing a foreign policy different from the other. However, this proved to be not much of a concern as delegates quickly sprung to action with addressing the issue and finding solutions to end the violations against women. The Disarmament and International Security Committee was convened, aiming to discuss the role of non-state actors in conflict regions. 38 members from the western world and third world nations took part, a major first for the conference. The All India Political Parties Meet witnessed over 32 members deliberating upon LGBTQ+ rights and the National Education Policy 2020. The delegates portrayed different political party values well, while coming together for innovative, inclusive ideas to help the next generations.

The International Press (IP) played their part with sheer diligence and their razor-sharp ability to track statements and question representatives and high-end officials. The press conferences were a treat to watch as questions rained from the IP, and at times, delegations and members were not able to stand the heat of the questions.

The closing ceremony was an informal and fun-filled affair, with laughter adorning the seminar hall. The winning delegates were announced and were congratulated by the HOD of H&M, Mrs Aparna Palle and the Convenor of the club, Mrs. Anupama. The closing ceremony concluded with the final declaration of closing the conference given by the Secretary-General.

On the whole, the conference was declared a grand success and would stay with the delegates for years to come.
