Dr. Meena Hariharan gave the example of a 30-year-old man who suffered from paralysis. According to the doctor's note, the patient had a small stroke and a history of hypertension.

He also mentioned that the patient had slight coordination problems in his left arm. The doctor stated he may return to work regularly after his therapy was completed. Yet the patient saw himself as an immobile guy who could never drive a car. Doctor contemplates hearing and treating the condition. Nonetheless, the patient reacts and responds in accordance with the healing that is taking place inside him. The sentence of the day was "Treatment & Cure is to body. Heal is to person"

Her fascinating story is an example of healing. She stated she developed a viral fever during her exams in masters. She needed complete rest, their family doctor said, and there were no appropriate medications. She continued to have a fever till the seventh day the doctor asked her whether he might put his hand under her pillow. Unexpectedly, he pulled out a number of books that she had been reading covertly in preparation for her tests. It wasn't the medical care which cured her but the healing which he gave her.

She concluded the session by mentioning that the culture places a strong emphasis on healing. While Bhagavath Geetha was preaching, healing was first reported in this world. Arjuna received a healing process from Lord Krishna. Healing does occur, but it must come from inside, which is nothing more than assistance.

Hima Sista said she has seen women working who were about 18 years old. They have backgrounds in a variety of fields, including law, medicine, and business administration. We don't expect everyone to be politically active, she said, even if we want each of us to be either an activist or a social personality. Advocacy is a crucial component of fellowship. It's time to stop being afraid to go outside. People in many nations rely on what the media portrays. Based on the media, public perception is always shifting.

In this panel, Mr. Jayash was asked a question about the key challenges faced by women in tech companies. Upon hearing it, he said that the problem is with the gender ratio in companies which is often 1:3 (women to men) in companies and this further comes down to 3:20 in the higher positions which has to be focused on. Ms. Rama Devi has given her insights on overcoming the gender barrier. Over the years there has been significant growth of women in research and tech policy. There are many policy frameworks that were made to make women feel more inclusive in this field. Ms. Rama feels that the core of the problem is with execution and implementation of plans which were made. Dr. Sriram has answered "How is it ensured that the government protects data?" by telling about the types of data sharing. He stated that open data is shared by the Government, however personal data is secured and not revealed. The key is to protect data while doing innovation, and it shouldn't be traceable to a person. He further gave information on different startups in privacy and security. Ms. Praveena was asked "What motivated her to become a leader". She expressed about the dilemmas of every engineer. The need to give back to the country and industry made her emerge as a leader. She as a leader feels it's important to know the difficulties of the employers from the bottom and voice has to be heard as a company.

She faced roadblocks such as being brought up from a lower middle class family and being a mother of two boys. She concluded that service is putting others in front of her and that it begins with them to be a public servant. Krishna Rao's opening remarks were like women have no adequate opportunities in this patriarchal society. When we have a resource and don't use it then it is called bad management. Life is a journey of all genders and change is a process. He observed the plight of his subordinate women while he was working in Andhra Pradesh and made many contributions which helped them. There is an act of pursuing pleasure in whatever the job role they are in and all are doing public service in their own way.

Sakshi Hallan is a very curious lady who had an early exposure to diversity in terms of economy, culture, policy and society. Inequality made her learn economy and the policy side of economy. The challenges that she saw in her life were women were not given equal pay and women are sideline as we see no growth in the organizations but they are just growing in numbers. The suggestions that were given by her were to have patience and to create space.

In the initiative to create a supportive environment for women leaders in all spheres, as part of the women in leadership conclave, "Healthtech Disrupted : AI and beyond" panel discussion has been hosted. Ms. Prerna has answered "What is the impact of AI & data science in healthcare?" by bringing up the 2 aspects - everyday activity (for common man) in consumer view and deep medical science for professionals in industrial view. She stated that Professional opinions are missing from the web about health. Technologists and Healthcare professionals should be making efforts towards that. She listed out the use cases of tech in the domain, which are, computational drug discovery, finding patterns for healthcare analysis. For health care professionals- Dr. Rooma Sinha has addressed the impact of tech for healthcare professionals.

Neelesh sir spoke about assistive devices for specific needs of patients, he emphasized that designing proper, affordable medical tech aid is important. He discussed the 21 categories of disabilities and stated that most of the devices are imported. There is a need for industry to come forward to develop the use of AI for specific needs.

2. Decryption encryption - The participant has to pick 3 chits which have aptitude questions one by one and the one who solves all three of them in 5 minutes is the winner.

It is followed by an insightful talk by Smt. Anuradha Kanchi, Principal strategist, Avtar- The Power of Diversity. The talk had its flow beginning with what equity means and how important is equity over equality and proceeded with the importance of upgrading and updating skills for every now and then for fitting in the workspace.
